Crisis Services

Veterans Crisis Line

If you're a service member, Veteran, National Guard member, Reservist in crisis or know someone who is, Dial 9-8-8 then Press 1 for immediate support. You can also Text 838255 or Chat Online at VeteransCrisisLine.net. You don't have to be enrolled with VA benefits or healthcare to call. If someone who is not a Veterans needs to speak to a crisis counselor, anytime 24.7 dial 988.

Multnomah County Crisis Line and Project Respond

Project Respond sends mental health professionals to where the person in crisis is located, to provide suicide/crisis risk assessment, crisis stabilization, safety planning, and transportation to emergency treatment facilities. The Unity Center provides emergency inpatient & residential psychiatric care for both adults and adolescents 9-17 years old. Services include psychiatric evaluation, hospital stay, medication, and referral to counseling/outpatient services.

Cascadia Healthcare's Urgent Walk-In Clinic offers same day mental health appointments, with services including suicide/crisis risk assessment, mental health screening, counseling, psychiatric prescriber services, and referrals to affordable long-term mental health care.

The Hawthorn provides urgent care services for mental health and addiction concerns, including suicide/crisis risk assessment, counseling, education regarding mental health and addiction, and peer support. No cost for uninsured patients - bill to insurance for insured patients.

Residential Services

Veterans Recovery House - Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program (RRTP)

The Veteran's Recovery House (VRH), is an inpatient program providing behavioral and medical healthcare services to Veterans who are homeless and/or want substance abuse treatment. The program is a transitional and residential environment with 24-hour support to Veterans admitted into the program.

Serving Washington County, Sequoia offers integrative residential mental health treatment that includes individual and group therapy, medication management, coordination with community services, and case management.

SMART Recovery is an evidenced-informed recovery method grounded in Rational Emotive Behavioral Therapy (REBT) and Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), that supports people with substance dependencies or problem behaviors.

Participants learn from one another's experiences, share coping strategies, and offer mutual encouragement. Groups are led by trained facilitators who are in recovery themselves.

New Narrative offers multiple peer-run non-clinical programs, including a one-year Wellness Program and a two-year Sustainable Housing Program. They also run NorthStar Clubhouse; a community space open to any resident of Portland over the age of 18 with a verified mental health diagnosis.

4D provides free substance use recovery peer support services to young adults 18-35 who live in Multnomah and Washington counties. These services include peer mentoring, 12-step meetings, other peer support groups, and access to 4D community centers.

NARA provides adult mental health services, guided by a cultural advisor and including cultural-specific programming for Native American communities. Services include mental health and psychiatric evaluations, individual and group counseling, medication management, and substance use treatment.
